

Goals of Therapy

Acute Treatment	Maintenance Treatment
 Identify specific mood episode (depression, hypomania/mania, mixed) 	 Continue medication successful as acute treatment (generally long-term)
 Select medication for rapid control of acute symptoms to minimize dysfunctionality 	 Restore functionality and QOL Prevent/minimize future mood episodes (relapse, recurrence)
 Prevent switch in polarity due to medication 	 Adjustment may be necessary (cover predominant polarity)


